## REVISED STANDARD VERSION

- 1** Comment on points of interest or difficulty in **four** of the following, with brief reference to the general context: [25]
- (a) He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. (Colossians 1:17)
  - (b) For I want you to know how greatly I strive for you, and for those at Laodicea, and for all who have not seen my face ... (Colossians 2:1)
  - (c) If with Christ you died to the elemental spirits of the universe, why do you live as if you still belonged to the world? Why do you submit to regulations, “Do not handle, Do not taste, Do not touch” ...? (Colossians 2:20–21)
  - (d) On the one hand, a former commandment is set aside because of its weakness and uselessness (for the law made nothing perfect); on the other hand, a better hope is introduced, through which we draw near to God. (Hebrews 7:18–19)
  - (e) Strive for peace with all men, and for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord. (Hebrews 12:14)
  - (f) Pray for us, for we are sure that we have a clear conscience, desiring to act honorably in all things. I urge you the more earnestly to do this in order that I may be restored to you the sooner. (Hebrews 13:18–19)
