

- 4 'The poor are contented, but the rich never are.' To what extent do you agree?

- **6** 'For most people, walking is the **only** exercise which is safe **and** accessible.' How far do you agree?
- 7 Assess the usefulness of the mathematics taught in **your** locality or region.
- 8 To what extent does communication technology divide one generation from another?

- **9** 'Today, sportswear is more a fashion statement than anything else.' Discuss.
- 10 'Sculptures made from materials like wood, clay, stone or glass have ornamental value but nothing else.' To what extent do you agree?
- 11 'Adverts have to be memorable to be successful.' Examine this claim.
- 12 'Everyone has a story to tell, but few write it down.' Explain why this might be the case.
