- 5 Critically consider the claim that Jain philosophy regards all viewpoints as equally true.
- 6 'Karma can have no significance if there is no self to be reborn.'
 Discuss this statement with reference to Theravada Buddhism.
- 7 Assess the claim that the life of the Buddha is a useful role model for Theravada Buddhists.
