2 'Umar II is remembered as the most pious of the Umayyad caliphs. Do you think he was the most effective of them?

3 How justified is the claim that the early 'Abbasid period up to the end of the death of al-Mutawakkil in 861 was a golden age of Islamic culture?

## Section B

4 Each of the four founders of the Sunni law schools followed his own particular principles and methods. Choosing two of these founders, describe and explain the main differences between them.

5 (a) Outline the methods used by any one of the collectors of the six canonical books of Sunni Hadiths in making their collections.
(b) Explain why these collectors thought it important to make their collections.

6 Abu al-Hasan al-Ash'ari is regarded as the great opponent of the Mu'tazili theologians. What were the main points of controversy between him and them?

## Section C

7 What are the essential differences between the position of Caliph in Sunni Islam and Imam in Shía Islam?

8 'Sufism brings a believer closer to God.' Give reasons to agree or disagree with this claim.

9 Al-Ghazali was an expert in philosophy, yet he rejected it completely. Explain why the majority of Muslims turned away from philosophy (falsafa).

## Section D

10 Do you think the teachings of Muhammad 'Abduh or the teachings of Hasan al-Banna' are more suited to the needs of Muslims today?

11 How far should Muslims living as minorities in non-Muslim societies be prepared to blend in with these wider societies?

12 'The Qur'an teaches Muslims everything they need to know about women's rights and responsibilities.' Give reasons to agree or disagree with this statement.
