Employment in the Kenyan tourism industry

Travel and Tourism generated 206 500 jobs directly this year and this is forecast to grow by 1.2% to 209 000.

This includes employment by hotels, travel agents, airlines and other passenger transportation services (excluding commuter services). It also includes, for example, the activities of the restaurant and leisure industries directly supported by tourists.

The total contribution of travel and tourism to employment, including indirect employment, was 543 500 jobs. By 2025, travel and tourism is forecast to support 732 000 jobs, an increase of 2.9% per year over the period.
