# Task 2 - Web Page

You work for Hothouse Design and will develop web pages for the Colorado Cabin Company.

Many of the people who will view the web page have a very slow internet connection, so efficient markup must be used.

- Create a new folder called CCC\_html
- Locate the following files and store them in your CCC\_html folder.

j1832cabin.jpg j1832logo.png j1832ss.css j1832text.txt

# • Create a web page called ccc.htm

This web page must work in all browsers and will have a table structure as shown below:

- Each table cell is identified with a letter and all dimensions are in pixels. The letters and dimensions shown in the table must **not** appear on your final web page.
- Table borders must not appear on the final web page.

  - Resize this image in the markup so that it is **570** pixels wide, maintaining the aspect ratio.

- Place in cell B the image j1832logo.png
  - Resize this image in the markup so that it is 316 pixels wide by 440 pixels high.

  - Using this example, explain in your own words how the browser interprets these fonts and why one value in the font-family definition has speech marks around it.

# Task 3 – Spreadsheet

You are going to prepare a spreadsheet model to calculate the hire (rental) costs of a log cabin. All currency values are in dollars to 2 decimal places.

Cabins can be hired by the day or by the week.

- Open the files **j1832booking.csv** and **j1832cost.csv** in a spreadsheet package and examine the contents.
  - Insert 3 new rows at the top of the file j1832booking.csv
  - Add text and formatting so that the spreadsheet looks like this:
