Task 1 – Evidence Document

- Open the file **j1832evidence.rtf**

Task 2 – Web Page

You work for Hothouse Design and will develop web pages for the Colorado Cabin Company.

Many of the people who will view the web page have a very slow internet connection, so efficient markup must be used.

- Create a new folder called **CCC_html**
- Locate the following files and store them in your *CCC_html* folder.
j1832cabin.jpg
j1832logo.png
j1832ss.css
j1832text.txt

- 1 • Create a web page called **ccc.htm**

This web page must work in all browsers and will have a table structure as shown below:

A 580 × 577	B 320 × 445
	C 320 × 132
D 900 × 200	
E 900 × 80	

- Each table cell is identified with a letter and all dimensions are in pixels. The letters and dimensions shown in the table must **not** appear on your final web page.
- Table borders must not appear on the final web page.

- 2 • Place in cell A the image **j1832cabin.jpg**
- Resize this image in the markup so that it is **570** pixels wide, maintaining the aspect ratio.

- 3 • Place in cell B the image **j1832logo.png**
- Resize this image in the markup so that it is **316** pixels wide by **440** pixels high.

- 4 • Make sure appropriate text is displayed if an image is not available.

- 5 • Place in cell C the text:
- Colorado Cabin Company**
- Set this text as style h1.

- 6 • Place in cell D the text from the file **j1832text.txt**
• Set all this text as style h2. [2]
- 7 • Place in cell E the text:
Website prepared for Hothouse Design by: followed by your name, Centre number and candidate number.
• Set this text as style h3. [2]
- 8 • Centre align the table in the browser. [1]
- 9 • Set the default target window so that a new page opens in the current window. [2]
- 10 • Make only the text *Hothouse Design* a hyperlink to the web page **<http://www.hothouse-design.co.uk>** which should open in a new window called **_new** [3]
- 11 • Make the image of the cabin a hyperlink to send an email message to **CCC@cambridgeinternational.org** with a subject line **Information request** [5]
- 12 • Attach the stylesheet **j1832ss.css** to the web page.
• Save the web page. [1]

EVIDENCE 1

Display the web page in your browser. If necessary, resize it so that:

- all the page can be seen
- all text can be easily read
- the address bar is visible.

Take a single screenshot of the browser window and place this in your Evidence Document.

EVIDENCE 2

Take a copy of the html source and place this in your Evidence Document.

- 13 • Open the stylesheet **j1832ss.css** in a suitable software package and examine its contents. In this stylesheet the style h1 is defined as *Times, "Times New Roman", serif*
- Using this example, explain in your own words how the browser interprets these fonts and why one value in the font-family definition has speech marks around it. [4]

EVIDENCE 3

Type your answer in your own words into your Evidence Document using no more than 100 words.

Task 3 – Spreadsheet

You are going to prepare a spreadsheet model to calculate the hire (rental) costs of a log cabin. All currency values are in dollars to 2 decimal places.

Cabins can be hired by the day or by the week.

- 14 • Open the files **j1832booking.csv** and **j1832cost.csv** in a spreadsheet package and examine the contents.
- Insert 3 new rows at the top of the file *j1832booking.csv*
 - Add text and formatting so that the spreadsheet looks like this:

Take a screenshot showing cells A1 to F11 of your spreadsheet, including the row and column headings. Place this in your Evidence Document.

- 15 • Place your name, Centre number and candidate number on the right in the header.
 • Place an automated field to display today's date on the left in the header.
 • Place an automated file name which includes the file path on the right in the footer.

For steps 16 to 22 you may enter test data to help you create your model.

- 16 • Restrict the data entry in cell B4 to **d** or **w**

Take a screenshot of your method of restricting the data entry. Place this in your Evidence Document.

- 17 • Enter a formula in cell D9 to display:
 ○ **daily** if cell B4 contains *d*
 ○ **weekly** if cell B4 contains *w*

Take a screenshot of your formula. Place this in your Evidence Document.

- 18 • Evaluate in your own words the restrictions you placed in cell B4.
 • Suggest how these restrictions could be improved.
 • Improve these restrictions in your spreadsheet, based upon this evaluation and your suggestion.

EVIDENCE 7

Type your evaluation and suggestion in your own words into your Evidence Document using no more than 100 words.

Take screenshots to show the improvements you have made to these restrictions. Place these in your Evidence Document.

- 19 • Enter a function in cell B9 to lookup the name of the cabin using the file *j1832cost.csv* [5]

- 20 • Enter a function in cell F9 to display the appropriate cost per day or per week for this cabin. [8]

- 21 • Enter a formula in cell B11 to calculate the total cost of hiring this cabin. [1]

- 22 • Apply appropriate formatting to all cells. [1]
- 23 • Save and print the spreadsheet showing the formulae. Make sure:
- it is in landscape orientation
 - row and column headings are displayed
 - the contents of all cells are fully visible.

Make sure that you have entered your **name**, **Centre number** and **candidate number** on your spreadsheet showing the formulae.

- 24 • Enter data to book a cabin with:
- the code **g**
 - a weekly rate for 2 weeks.

- 25 • Print the spreadsheet showing the values. Make sure the:
- printout fits on a single page
 - contents of all cells are fully visible.
- [1]

Make sure that you have entered your **name**, **Centre number** and **candidate number** on your spreadsheet showing the values.

- 26 • Change the booking to book a cabin with code **b** for **3** days. [1]
- 27 • Print the spreadsheet showing the values. Make sure the:
- printout fits on a single page
 - contents of all cells are fully visible.
