	boiled potato-(enzyme/catalase) inactive/destroyed/denatured;		
	more oxygen/gas/bubbles released from smaller pieces of raw potato <b>ORA</b> ;  small pieces—greater surface area/more enzyme exposed/ <b>AW</b> / <b>ORA</b> ;
