- (b) Explain why some scholars think that not all of Matthew's Gospel was written by Matthew the apostle. [6]
- (c) 'Matthew's Gospel was not written to be an accurate historical account.'  
To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered different points of view. [8]

- 2 (a) Describe the visit of the Magi (**RSV** wise men) to the infant Jesus. [6]
- (b) Explain the significance of the visit by the Magi (**RSV** wise men) in the birth story in Matthew. [6]
- (c) 'Jesus was not the type of Messiah that the Jews expected.'  
To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered different points of view. [8]

- 3 (a) Give an account of Jesus' teaching about prayer in the Sermon on the Mount. [6]
- (b) Explain what the prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane reveals about Jesus. [6]
- (c) 'Christians should pray for others, not for themselves.'  
To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered different points of view. [8]

- 4 (a) Give an account of the healing of two demon-possessed men (**RSV** two demoniacs) in the region of the Gadarenes. [6]
- (b) Explain what this story might show about the person of Jesus. [6]
- (c) 'Demon possession does not happen today.'

- 5 (a) Give an account of the parable when Jesus compared the kingdom of heaven to ten virgins (RSV maidens). [6]
- (b) Explain the teaching in this parable. [6]

To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered different points of view. [8]
