

According to a Chinese newspaper, there is much more traffic on the roads because the economy is growing so fast. The old roads are too weak and too narrow to bear the load of such heavy modern lorries. New roads are needed to bring coal from the mines to the big factories in the area. Some time later I read that it took two or three more days to clear the road.
