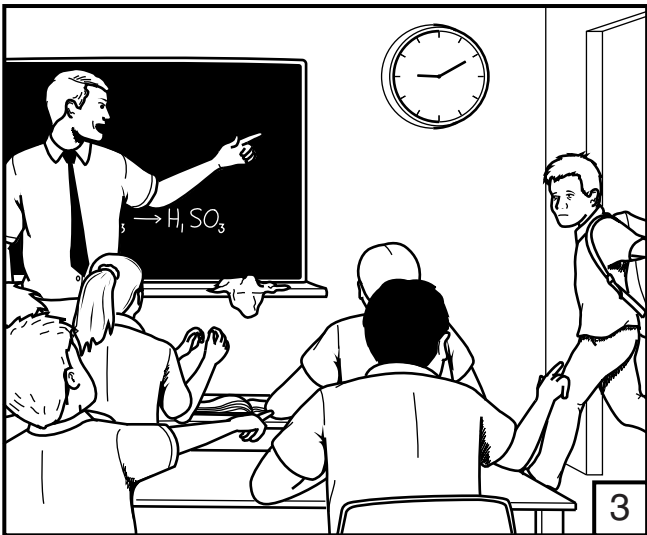

1 Write in **Spanish** in the **Past Tense**, using 140–150 words, the story told in the series of pictures below.



2 Write in **Spanish** a composition of 140–150 words on **one** of the following:
